Background

- New regime institutional tuition fees since 2022-2023
- Overall: more income for the schools
- Recommendation UC and CvB: explore whether extra income through institutional fees can be combined with extra waivers / scholarships for students who are unable to fund their (entire) study themselves
- Education directors have been asked if/how they are willing to expand waiver practices
- Institutional Fee Committee proposes to boost existing waiver/scholarship programs: the
 Erasmus University Holland Scholarship and the Erasmus Trust Fund



Erasmus University Holland Scholarship (1/4)

Quantity and duration

- One year funding
- Monthly installments
- Components of 5K, with max of three components pp
- Components of 5K, divided over faculties



Amount in € and budget source

- €5.000, € 10.000 or €15.000 (to be decided by the faculty), for housing and living costs
- One component of 5K consists of 2,5K budget from OCW and 2,5K matching from the CvB's profileringsfonds (EUR Financial Support Fund)



Erasmus University Holland Scholarship (2/4)

Requirements

- 1. Applied for full-time bachelor of master
- 2. non-EEA nationality
- 3. Unable to finance study
- 4. Excellent student (according to faculty's standards)
- 5. No Dutch diploma obtained yet
- 6. No previous enrolment at Dutch university
- 7. Waiver can be received only once
- 8. You meet faculty-specific requirements, if applicable

Schools carry out the selection.

Erasmus University Holland Scholarship (4/4)

How can schools expand the Erasmus University Holland Scholarships?

- Currently: one component of 5K consists of 2,5K budget from OCW and 2,5K matching from the CvB's Financial Support Fund (profileringsfonds EUR)
- Option: schools reserve 10% of the distributed components to be able to award more components in total. If the amount is 5k>, then it can be added to an existing component

Erasmus Trust Fund Scholarship (1/3)

Quantity and duration

- One year funding (or 2 years, in case of RMA)
- 8 per year (1 per faculty)



Amount in € and budget source

- Trust Fund provides € 15.000 for housing, living costs and statutory fee
- If the scholarship is awarded to a non-EEA student, the school covers the difference between the statutory fee and the institutional tuition fee. The school decides if the scholarship is awarded to an EEA or non-EEA student



Erasmus Trust Fund Scholarship (2/3)

Requirements

- 1. Applied for full-time master
- 2. Considered a high achieving student
- 3. Unable to finance study
- 4. For both EEA and non-EEA nationalities

Schools carry out the selection.



Erasmus Trust Fund Scholarship (3/3)

How can we expand the Erasmus Trust Fund Scholarships?

- Currently: 1 scholarship per school per year
- Option to expand to 2 scholarships per school per year (Trust Fund is interested to explore this possibility/to finding donators)
