<b>Explanation</b>	This proposal seeks to strengthen academic freedom and freedom of expression at Erasmus University Rotterdam (EUR). In light of growing concerns regarding the decline of these fundamental rights within Dutch higher education, evidenced by national and European reports, this document outlines a strategic response. The goal of this initiative is to safeguard the university's commitment to fostering a vibrant academic community where ideas can be freely exchanged and intellectual diversity is celebrated. It includes concrete action plans to address issues impacting academic freedom. Through this proposal, we aim to reinforce the university's mission of creating positive societal impact by ensuring that all members of the university community have the freedom to express diverse and dissenting opinions without fear of repercussion.
<b>If applicable reason for urgency or emergency</b>	The urgency of this proposal stems from a documented decline in academic freedom and freedom of expression across Dutch higher education, which aligns with troubling trends across Europe. Recent evaluations, including the Academic Freedom Index and studies by the Education Inspectorate, indicate that the environment for free academic discourse is deteriorating rapidly. These issues are not only pressing but potentially damaging to the reputation and effectiveness of our institution. Action is required to address these challenges to prevent further erosion of academic integrity and to ensure that our university remains a leader in upholding democratic values and academic excellence. Additionally, upcoming national policy discussions and university evaluations make it imperative that we address these concerns promptly to shape positive outcomes and reinforce our commitment to academic freedom.
<b>Specific Questions</b>	<p>This proposal raises and addresses several critical questions that are pivotal to understanding and improving the current state of academic freedom and freedom of expression at Erasmus University Rotterdam:</p> <p>What is the current state of academic freedom at our university, as reflected in national and international indexes?</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
