Hieronder de reactie op de vragen van SC op Windows 11:

- Dropbox: Most research staff use it frequently. We can request it individually, but we will all get it approved. How does it work? --> Dropbox itself has been found to be not secure enough as an application. EUR policy is to phase out Dropbox more and more. Current collaborations in Dropbox are currently tolerated and there are projects underway to better organize and promote alternatives. Dropbox is therefore no longer approved for everyone, only by exception. The Dropbox Application is available again, but only for the ones who have a license.
- Browser: Is there a restriction on the compatible browsers? --> In the sense that only Edge is available at the moment, there is indeed a limitation.
- Local admin rights: Some employees need local admin rights for their work (to use certain software). How is this facilitated under Windows 11? -->
 After inventory, a lot of software is packaged and made available. But for those who have admin rights, it is a risk to grant admin rights to colleagues in an environment with several thousand workstations. If certain software is needed, this can be made possible in various ways:
 - First option is with a package if it has to be made available to a larger group
 - Second option is whitelisting an application, an approval that the software has been approved for download. This assessment process takes about a week.
 - Third option is installation on other environments, on the laptop itself via a virtual desktop (Hyper-V) or if more resources are needed (computing capacity) then via Virtual Research Environment.
- CBS: Has the census data access been solved? Do we need to request it
 individually? --> It is solved, anyone who had CBS should be able to use it.
 If not, please contact servicedesk or BI&AM
- SAP: Any update on SAP compatibility? --> Since last tuesday it is fixed. SAP/Corsa/Liveoffice users are able to update.
